Volunteer's In Preparation Training

In order to be recognized as a 4-H volunteer in the Wisconsin 4-H youth development program, all adults age 18 years and older must complete the Volunteers In Preparation (VIP) training. The purpose of this training is to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all participants. VIP training is step 3 of 4 to become a certified leader in 4-H and for your years of service to count.

VIP replaces Youth Protection Training

Steps to become a certified 4-H leader:

- 1. Enroll on 4-Honline to become a leader
- 2. Complete background check
- 3. Complete Volunteers In Preparation training
- 4. Complete the Mandated Reporter training found on 4-H online.
- *Once you have completed ALL of these steps then you are considered a certified 4-H leader.
