Local Highlight: Heather Noskowiak, 4-H Leader

Hello! I hope everyone is as anxious as I am for some warmer weather! For those of you that don't know me, my name is Heather Noskowiak. I have been involved in 4-H since I was old enough to join. I was active in the Dairy and Swine Projects. I participated in various dairy judging events. Now 20 years later, I am the Dairy Chairman and club leader for the Bryant Hi-Flyers which my family started 25+ years ago. Since being becoming the Dairy Chairman 1½ years ago, I wanted to make it my goal to get the youth more involved in the project and to know more about the project. With the help of the committee, we have dairy judging events at 2 area farms, 2 farm tours, judging at MilkSource, a Showmanship Clinic (with another planned for the end of May), sold water at the Dairy Breakfast, helped out with the Sustainable Farm Tour, sold tshirts, Dairy Quiz Bowl (hopefully we can have a couple teams next year), and a clipping clinic that we plan on doing in May. We have also made sure to get our Youth Reps: McKenzie Schroepfer, Alexia Nelson, and Nick Wild are more involved with the project.

The dairy project means a lot to me and my family. I grew up on a 100-cow dairy farm in Bryant. My favorite part of being on the farm was being able to pick out my fair animals with my mom, dad, and uncle. I remember one of my favorite cows I showed. She wasn't the best looking cow, but I took her cause we worked well together and I knew I would do well in Showmanship with her. She made an appearance at the fair 5 or 6 times! I became very proud of the work my family put into the farm. I was even more excited when my kids were old enough to start showing. My kids are the 3rd generation of Brandts to show. My dad always talked about his show days when he was younger....and that picture is hanging on my fridge as I type this. We never had the biggest, flashiest, or fanciest cows, but we were still proud of our ribbons and the work we put in. My oldest, Braeden who is 14, is in his 6th year in the dairy project. His heart is in the swine project and archery project but since his sister started showing 4 years ago, he just wants to beat her in the ring! I secretly think he enjoys showing his heifers too. Now my middle child, Alli who is 12, is a lot like me and could live in the barn. She is always going down to the farm to check out the new calves born and is super excited because her Brown Swiss heifer freshened (with a bull calf) and we have a Swiss calf and few other great prospects for her and Braeden to show this year. Alli loves the dairy project and I can see a bright future for her in the dairy industry.

For the last 4 years, our 4-H club has been making and selling pizzas. Each time we usually pick a cause, club, group, etc to donate to. This year was our best year and the kids sold over 250 pizzas!!!! At our March, meeting the club members donated \$225 to the new wash rack that will be going in on the Northwest corner of the Livestock Pavilion. We have a committee working on this project, have written letters, and done some fundraising for the project already. Justin Schroepfer, Jason Nagel, Charlie Wild, Samantha Solin and I have been involved in the planning of the project along with Kathy Bowman has graciously helped with the communication end of it and typed up a few things for us. We held a Culver's Night in Feb and the kids raised close to \$200 (including tips), we collected \$250 from the Antigo Optimist Club, now we have the money from our club as well. We are also doing the Parsons Oil Change (April or May??) and we have another Culver's Night planned for April 2nd. So let Culver's cook for your family that night and let the Livestock and Dairy youth wait on you!

Our 4-H club came up with a challenge for other 4-H clubs, groups, committees, and area businesses to donate money to the wash rack as well. Within a few hours of posting the challenge, Deerbrook Eager Beavers decided to take us up on the challenge and they donated \$250 towards the new wash rack!!! I am so excited for good things to come with this project. This new wash rack will benefit all of our livestock youth. It will provide better accessibility, safety for our youth and for the general public. It will also allow the public to see youth working with their animals and see what it takes to get that animal "show ready."

We live in a great and supportive community. I am proud and honored to be a part of it and to be able to work with such great youth! #4Hgrown.

4-H Leader Enrollments

Don't forget that ALL 4-H leaders should enroll every year so you remain active as a leader in our system. It also allows you to continue to receive the newsletter and to let us recognize you accurately for your years of service. Plus, it is a state requirement that we get the signed list of volunteer behavior guidelines annually. The state is also requiring that we now do criminal background checks on our volunteers every four years.

4-H volunteer leaders please take note that you are required to complete the mandated reporter training that is on 4-H online. If you completed Youth Protection Training and have not let your 4-H enrollment lapse you are not required to do this training as it was part of the youth protection training.

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



SPECIAL SUGGESTIONS:

<u>Theme</u>: Does the poster attract attention, focus your interest on the idea and motivate you to take action? Is the message brief and direct?

Simplicity: Is the poster limited to one idea and readable at a glance?

Originality: Does the poster convey an original idea?

<u>Pleasing Composition/Attractiveness</u>: Is the poster well balanced and neatly done? Is the size in accordance with the rules? Does it cover the whole board? Is it free from smudges? Do the images need outlining?

Step back 8-10 feet... Can you read it clearly?

4-H Emblem: Do not place anything over or on top of it. The emblem should only be in green, black, white, or gold/yellow.

- 4. Complete the Mandated Reporter training found on 4-H online.
- *Once you have completed ALL of these steps then you are considered a certified 4-H leader.

Market Animal Swine 2019 Weigh-in rules & Information

There will not be a swine weigh-in prior to fair. In its place each exhibitor will need to submit the following:

- 1 photo front view (head) of swine visibly showing ear tag.
- 1 photo side view of swine with the exhibitor in the photo.
- Weigh-in forms need to be filled out, please indicate if it's a family weigh-in.
- Premise ID must be included on weigh-in form.
- Bill of sale.

ALL INFORMATION IS DUE TO THE 4-H OFFICE FRIDAY APRIL 12 -BEFORE 4:30PM

- Ear taggers are available for check out, must be returned within 3 days of check out. And cleaned per the instructions provided. If you are uncomfortable using tagger please contact a Market Animal Chair to assist you.
- Exhibitors must use the ear tags that are provided for them at the extension office.
- All swine exhibitors must take YQCA and submit a copy of their YQCA certificate to the Extension office by July 1.
- Swine must be born after January 1 of current year.
- Performance swine contest will replace rate of gain.
- All swine on fairgrounds will be sent to a processing plant.

Dairy: judging, showmanship, and poster contest;


Livestock: judging (beef, sheep, swine, and possibly meat goat),

Youth Tractor & Machinery Safety Certification Course

This 24-hour program meets the requirements of Wisconsin Act 455, which requires youth under the age of 16 to hold a certificate of training in order to operate a tractor or self-propelled implement of husbandry on a public road. It also meets the child labor requirements in agriculture under the Fair Labor Standards Act, pertaining to the employment of youth ages 14-15 on farms not operated by their parents or guardians.

The fee for this class is \$75 per youth, which includes the training manual and handouts. Lunch IS provided.

Schedule:

- June 17, 8:30 a.m. 3 p.m. begin at Quinlan's Equipment, Hwy 45 South of Antigo then move to Langlade County Resource Center
- June 18, 9:00 a.m. 3 p.m. we will meet at the Langlade County Resource Center and take a bus to an area farm for Ag Hazards Training.
- June 19, 9:00 a.m. 3 p.m. at Langlade County Resource Center
- June 20, 9:00 am-3:00 at Quinlan's for Written and Driving tests

On the first day, parents should wait until we confirm that youth can reach the tractor controls. Once we have confirmed youth can reach the tractor controls, we will move to the classroom in Resource Center.


