## LANGLADE COUNTY 4-H NEWSLETTER 4-H Forecast - May 2019

## **GROW LANGLADE COUNTY**

Langlade County 4-H, Master Gardeners, UWEX Agriculture Department, and FoodWlse are teaming up to educate the clients of the Antigo Food Pantry about growing and harvesting vegetables. This initiative is sponsored by the grant from Grow Together Wisconsin.

The program will provide 4-H youth with a voice in the community that will help strengthen their leadership skills while providing "hot topics" in gardening and healthy food choices.

**The Need:** 34% of Langlade County residents have incomes in the poverty rate. **The Outcomes:** 

•Provide nutrition and gardening education along with a steady crop of vegetables to the Antigo Food Pantry clients.

•Encourage clients to prepare their food from "scratch".

•Provide desired fresh vegetables.

•Teamwork: Master Gardeners will work with a team of 4-H youth to establish four raised garden beds outside the pantry. Harvested items will be used for demonstration and pantry distribution.

•4-H youth will gain leadership skills used not only for gardening but also for providing pantry clients with an understanding of how to grow their own healthy meal options. **Intended Audience:** 

•Food Pantry Clients: The Antigo Food Pantry serves low-income families from across Langlade County. They see over 350 family units a month. We hope to reach approximately 20 people each workshop.

#### 4-H's Action Plan:

Team Building: Leadership; Growing Vegetables; and more.
Growing a variety of vegetables in 4 different raised beds and maintaining the gardens throughout the summer.

 Assisting with assembly of the raised beds, planting of vegetables.
 Providing a few lessons on raising vegetables, container growing, and making healthy snacks for the Food Pantry clients.

•Harvesting the vegetables for the Food Pantry.

#### **4-H Leader Enrollments**

Don't forget that ALL 4-H leaders should enroll every year so you remain active as a leader in our system. It also allows you to continue to receive the newsletter and to let us recognize you accurately for your years of service. Plus, it is a state requirement that we get the signed list of volunteer behavior guidelines annually. The state is also requiring that we now do criminal background checks on our volunteers every four years. *To enroll go to 4honline.com and click on Wisconsin!* 

4-H volunteer leaders please take note that you are required to complete the mandated reporter training that is on 4-H online. If you completed Youth Protection Training and have not let your 4-H enrollment lapse you are not required to do this training as it was part of the youth protection training.

## **Inclement Weather/Cancellation Policy**

Langlade County 4-H programs (county, club and groups) are automatically canceled if any of the following occur:

-Langlade County or the location where the event is scheduled to occur is under a Winter Storm, Wind Chill, Tornado, Blizzard or Severe Thunderstorm Warning issued by the National Weather Service

-Travel is not advised due to snow, wind or ice storms.

-Schools are closed for the day or closing early

## **4-H Poultry Exhibitors**

The law requiring pullorum testing for "persons who use poultry or farmraised game birds or their eggs for breeding or hatching or for the exhibition at a fair or livestock exhibition" has been waived as of April 26, 2019. The waiver will remain until it is determined that pullorum antigen is sufficiently available. It is unclear when that date may be.

#### SPECIAL SUGGESTIONS:

Theme: Does the poster attract attention, focus your interest on the idea and motivate you to take action? Is the message brief and direct?
Simplicity: Is the poster limited to one idea and readable at a glance?
Originality: Does the poster convey an original idea?
Pleasing Composition/Attractiveness: Is the poster well balanced and neatly done? Is the size in accordance with the rules? Does it cover the whole board? Is it free from smudges? Do the images need outlining? Step back 8-10 feet?
Can you read it?
4-H Emblem: Do not place anything over or on top of it. The em-

blem should only be in green, black, white, or gold/yellow.

## Highlight of the Month

Hi my name is Allison Noskowiak and I am member of the Bryant Hi Flyers 4-H club. I am a 6<sup>th</sup> grader at the Antigo Middle School. I am actively involved in my 4-H club. I am involved in Archery, Air Rifle, Dairy, and Swine projects. This year I am planning on taking 4 or 5 dairy animals to the fair and my 2 pigs (which we haven't named yet). On April 3<sup>rd</sup>, my brother and 2 other swine youth went to the Show Pig Clinic in Wausau at the NTC. It was put on by Robert Reinhardt who is a ShowRite feed rep and also has is own mini ranch and raises Hereford pigs all across the country. He invited a livestock judge from Missouri who is also a feed rep for ShowRite feed. He started off by talking about how to pick out your show pig and what to look for. He then talked to us about what we need to do to keep our show pig healthy, clean, and well fed. He stressed to us that the pens need to be kept clean and dry especially this time of year when the pigs are more susceptible to disease or sickness. He

also talked about keeping clean feed and water in front of them. If we are not going to drink it, then they won't either. He also talked about washing the pigs and conditioning them and what to use on them. He said he doesn't spend lots of money on those products because they all work the same.

Then he had talked about showmanship and walking your pig(s). He suggested to walk them through some tall grass because that will make them keep their head up and he also talked about what



we should be using like a cane, whip, pipe, show stick, etc. Canes are not very common anymore and shouldn't be used. I also learned where you can tap on your animal as you don't want to damage any of the meat on them. And he says he always laughs when people are using the pump sprayers during the show on their pig and getting them wet cause that does nothing for them. If you want to cool them down, you need to spray their bellies as pigs can't sweat and the thinnest part of their skin is their belly.



I am glad my mom took us over there because I learned a lot and some things I already knew. It was nice to have a clinic that talked about show pigs instead of pigs, beef, and sheep. Now to wait for the snow to be gone so we can get working with them outside!

## Langlade County 4-H Raffle License Policy Guidelines for use of the Langlade County 4-H Raffle License

- For accountability purposes, the Langlade County 4-H Leaders Association is the sole possessor of the Langlade County 4-H Raffle License. The Leaders Association considers the goal of the 4-H programs as providing educational, hands-on opportunities for the youth of Langlade county, and not as a fund raising body. The Leaders Association does, however, grant the use of their Wisconsin State Raffle License to other chartered Langlade county 4-H groups under the following conditions.
- Any team, project, club, or individual wishing to sponsor a raffle MUST complete the Langlade County Raffle Request form and submit it to the Extension office at least six weeks prior to the printing/ purchase of the raffle tickets.
- Raffle funds must be used to benefit a club or project within the Langlade County 4-H program. Multiple clubs and projects can co-sponsor raffles, as long as all parties are identified on the Request Form.
- Refer to the state and national policy sheets for further explanation regarding use of the 4-H name and emblem, expectations for youth involvement, and other 4-H fund raising guidelines.
- Essential rules are summarized here. For complete rules regarding Class A and Class B raffles, see the "Statutory Requirements for Raffles in Wisconsin" pamphlet at www.doa.state.wi.us/gaming . Class A: All raffle tickets shall be identical in form and include the number of the license, name and address of the sponsoring organization, price of the ticket, place for the purchaser to enter name and address, date, time and place of drawing, and a list of each prize which has a retail value of \$500 or more. Each ticket must include a separate identification number, printed on both the purchaser's and the organization's portion of the ticket, numbered consecutively. No ticket may exceed \$100 in cost.
  - Class B: All raffle tickets shall be identical in form, need not be numbered consecutively, and may not exceed \$10 in cost. Drawings must be held in public, purchaser of ticket must be present to win, unless ticket is given by purchaser to another person who is present. All prizes shall be awarded.
  - All Raffles: Each organization licensed to conduct raffles shall maintain a list of the names and addresses of all persons winning prizes with a retail value of \$100 or more, and the prizes won, for at least 12 months after each raffle is conducted. The list shall be available at reasonable times for public examination and shall be provided to the department upon request.
- The Langlade County 4-H Leaders Association board will review the request, and make a final decision. Requesters are highly encouraged to attend the board meeting, so that questions can be answered at that time. The board reserves the right to limit the use of the raffle license.
- Once the raffle has been completed, the user(s) of the license are required to submit a brief written report to the Langlade County 4-H Leaders Association, within one week of the drawing.
