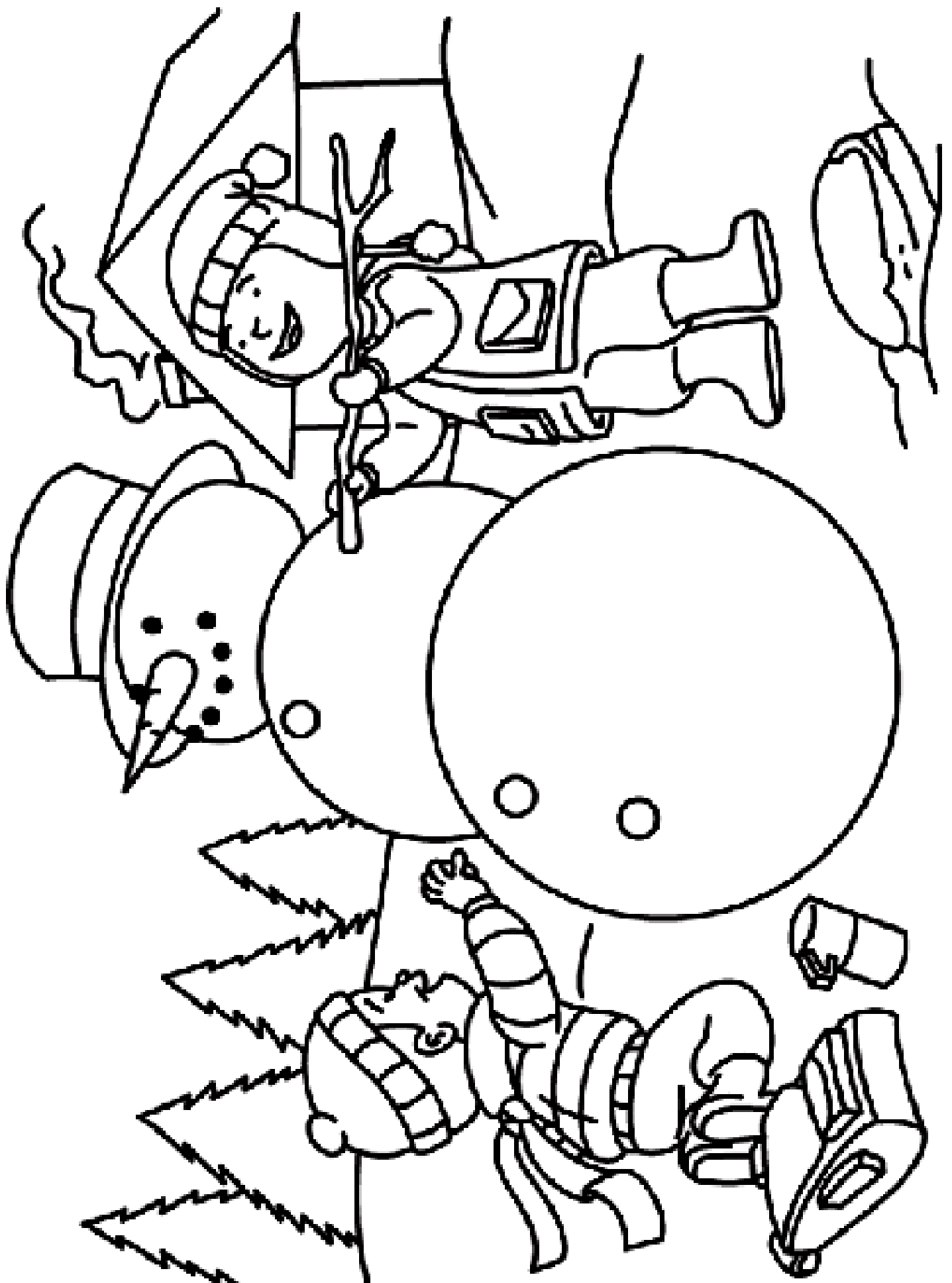

VIP TRAINING



Are you a new leader?

To be recognized as a 4-H volunteer in the Wisconsin 4-H Youth Development program, all adults ages 18 years and older must complete the Volunteers In Preparation (VIP) training. The purpose of this training is to ensure the safety and well-being of all participants. VIP training is step 4 of 4 to become a certified leader in 4-H.

Steps to become a certified 4-H leader:

1. Enroll on 4-Honline to become a leader
2. Complete background check
3. Complete the Mandated Reporter training found on 4-H online.
4. Complete Volunteers In Preparation training

*Once you have completed *ALL* of these steps then you are considered a certified 4-H leader.

Returning leaders, consider attending for a refresher.

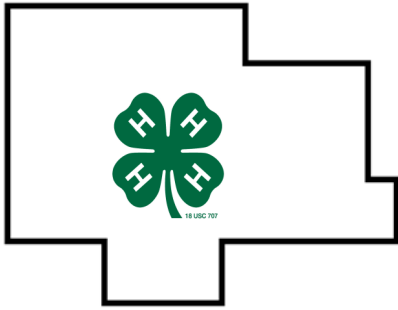
