April 22, 2020 Update to WI 4-H Programs

Dear 4-H families -

We are writing to share the latest update on the impact of COVID-19 on 4-H programs. In response to the continued need for physical distancing to prevent the spread of COVID-19, University of Wisconsin-Madison Extension (including Wisconsin 4-H) is cancelling or postponing all in-person programs through the end of May and all programming with more than 50 people through June. In addition, all overnight residential programs will be canceled or postponed **through June** because of the difficulty of maintaining social distance. Upham Woods overnight programming and youth programming taking place on the UW-Madison campus have been cancelled through the summer.

Extension is continuing to monitor the situation to maintain the flexibility to support other statewide programming for the remainder of the summer, and to adapt our approaches if needed. When we emerge from this phase of the epidemic, we will likely have to start programming gradually, and in ways that limit potential exposure. Even though 4-H might not be the same as we have been anticipating, our clear thinking and commitment to larger service will get us through. 4-H staff, volunteers, and youth have been creating learning opportunities that can be done via the web and finding ways that members of a single household can learn and serve together. We are working with fairs and other summer programs to explore ways to continue learning and showcasing projects.

We hope to communicate changes with 6 weeks notice, to allow for planning, but this is an evolving situation. Check the state website (https://4h.extension.wisc.edu/) in early May for updates on June and July programs.

Don't wait until the last minute! Take advantage of this time now!


- Create a poster or display for your project area
